

HOW MANY NOVA SCOTIANS WERE HURT AT WORK IN 2018?



There were 5,819 TIME-LOSS CLAIMS IN 2018. 87 FEWER NOVA SCOTIANS were hurt seriously enough to lose time from work, compared to 2017, when there were 5,906 time-loss claims.





It's taking a long time to achieve a return to work when someone is hurt on the job. In 2018, the average composite duration rose to

127 DAYS.

More complex claims, and the increasing age of the population, are just two of the many factors in this complex measure.





INDUSTRY: A CLOSER LOOK

Five of the six largest industries, measured by assessable payroll, showed improvements in injury frequency rate per 100 covered employees compared to 2017.
