Labour Federation calls on Government to make worker health and safety a top priority

Halifax, N.S. – Nova Scotia Federation of Labour Rick Clarke will speak at this year's Day of Mourning ceremony at Province House to remember, pay tribute to and mourn for the 29 Nova Scotian workers who lost their lives in 2008, the highest number since the Westray Disaster.

April 28, 2009 is the 25th anniversary of the Day of Mourning, yet over 1000 Canadians were killed at or because of work. In addition, almost 32,000 workers were injured on the job. Clearly more needs to be done to protect workers to ensure they are able to return home at the end of their day.

"After a quarter century of remembering and paying tribute to the thousand plus workers that have been killed at or because of work each year; we believe it is beyond the time for government to assume a more proactive role in protecting our workers," Clarke said.

Enforcement of existing laws must be improved and new and improved health and safety regulations have to be established in a number of areas.

Clarke noted that Labour is calling for special prosecutors to be set up in each province and territory and at the federal level where appropriate. The task of these special prosecutors would be to investigate and lay criminal charges where it is found that employer's actions or inactions have resulted in serious injury or death.

"The Nova Scotia Government must assume a more proactive role in protecting our workers and put this at the top of its agenda. We call on Premier Rodney MacDonald to announce that a proper health and safety program in every Nova Scotia workplace is a priority.

"A person's life should not be at risk when they are at work. Every workplace death or injury is preventable. We are committed to continue our campaign for better enforcement of existing occupational health and safety legislation and for stronger legislation to ensure every Nova Scotian will come home from work, injury-free," said Clarke in conclusion.
