





We've made important gains over time when it comes to injury durations, but the challenges we face in supporting safe and timely return to work were highlighted in 2017, when the injury durations index rose to

In 2017 there were **16** chronic deaths. Deaths classified as "chronic" include two categories:

 deaths related to occupational diseases or conditions, often from previous

exposures; and deaths occurring at a workplace, from other health conditions not necessarily related to the work, primarily cardiac events.

In 2017, there were 5 acute fatalities, caused by traumatic injuries at a workplace.

MUSCLE STRAIN from lifting is still the most common workplace injury, and the **BACK** is most often affected.




