Financial Support for Families



One-Time Payments

- A \$15,000 benefit is provided to help support your immediate financial needs.
- An additional \$15,000 Burial Benefit is available to assist with personal arrangements following your loved one's passing.



Ongoing Benefits

- Monthly benefits equal to 85% of your loved one's wages will be provided to the surviving spouse until at least age 65. These payments will continue until the later of either the date the worker would have turned 65 or the date the surviving spouse reaches 65.
- 5% of these benefits will be set aside for a survivor annuity, which will be provided as a one-time payment at age 65.



Support for Children

- If there are surviving children, monthly benefits will be provided to the spouse until the child turns 18.
- If the child pursues postsecondary education, benefits may continue up to age 25, depending on the length of their program.
